32: Medical advice: phone this code to obtain medical advice.

38: Medical assistance: phone this code if the condition of an ill or injured person aboard the vessel requires urgent evacuation ashore or the services of a doctor aboard the vessel. This code ensures the call is routed to the appropriate agency or authority ashore to deal with the situation.

Streaming IP - Guaranteed rates for live applications like video conferencing and database synchronisation (FB250 and FB500 terminals only).

Enhanced voice services - Voicemail and other enhanced call management options are available, including caller identification, caller barring and call forwarding.

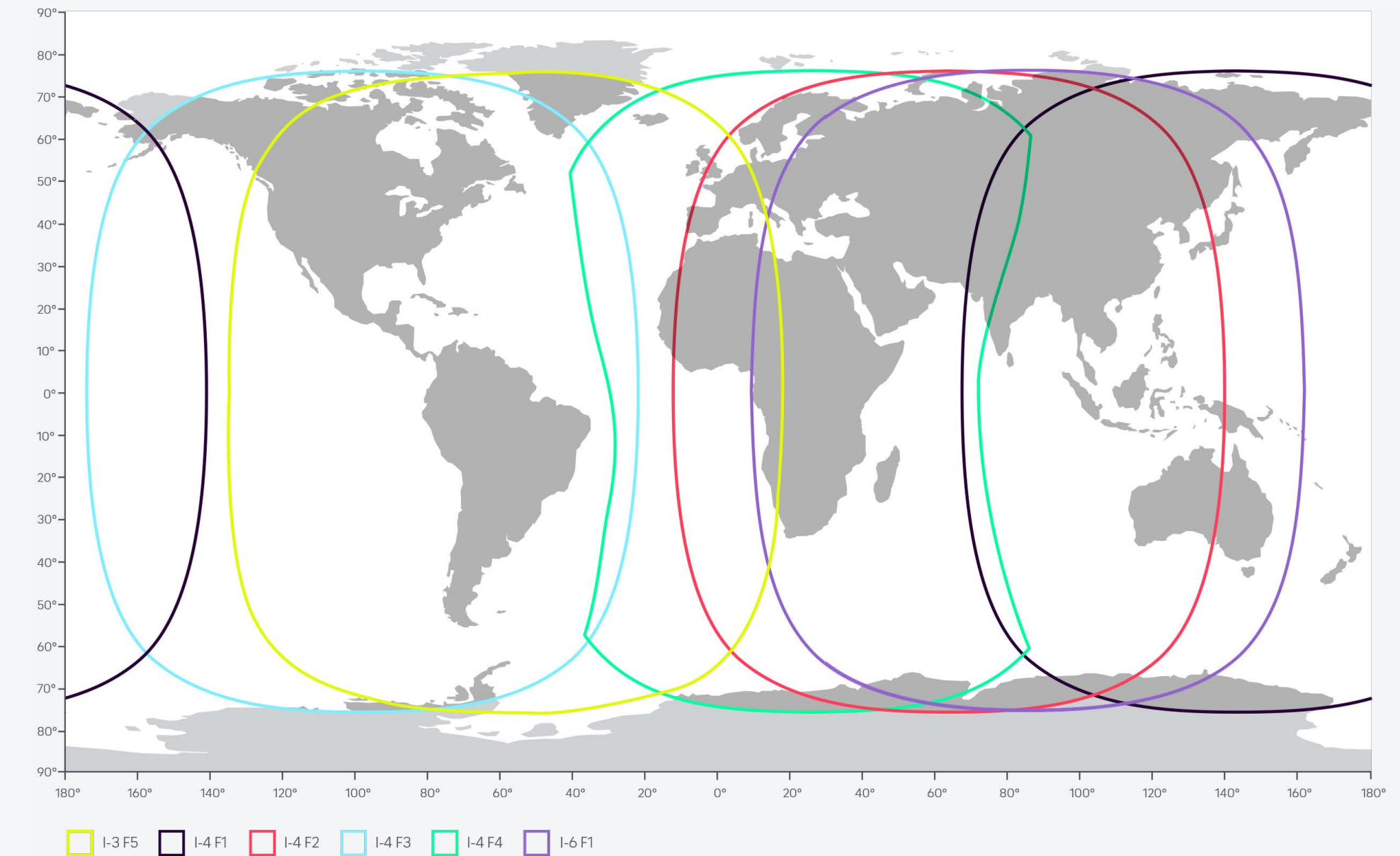
